The Mental Health Association's 2011 Fiscal Year was one of growth, development and forward thinking. A Capital Campaign, a Building Renovation and an Organizational Assessment have been the hallmark of MHA's ongoing efforts to be an efficient, responsible and sustainable community resource.

We continued to rent out the building at 226 S. Jefferson St. that we purchased in March of 2010 while we completed all of the architectural, engineering and other pre-planning work. Construction began in August of 2011, with an anticipated move-in date of late spring 2012.

The public phase of our Capital Campaign began in October 2010, with 50% of the \$3.4 million having been raised in the silent phase. The Ausherman Family Trust very generously granted us a second \$200,000 matching grant, we were awarded a City Community Development Block Grant, and several supporters opened their homes to us for receptions, all of which helped to jumpstart this phase. The overwhelming support from individuals, foundations and businesses for this project has affirmed that MHA's dream of a first stop for Mental Health in Frederick County is actually a shared community vision.

With our external renovation in full swing, it was time to take a look inward. A Capacity Building Grant from the Ausherman Family Foundation enabled MHA to conduct an organizational assessment in order to ensure that our agency's administrative infrastructure is able to keep pace with the rapid program growth and demand in services that we've experienced over the last several years.

Please take the time to read through this report where you will see that, with your help, MHA continues to positively impact children, adults and families in Frederick and the surrounding region.





Students come to us with their rolling cosmetic cases containing the tools of the trade, and far too often, they also carry some heavier baggage that can become overwhelming. While I can train students in professional best practices, I don't have all the answers when it comes to helping these young adults cope with many of the life challenges they face. That is why the Mental Health Association is such an important partner.

A student came to me seeking support. Her grief at losing a child had become overwhelming. The passion and drive she once had, seemed to have slipped away, and she struggled just to get through each day. I told her about the 2-1-1 information and referral hotline operated by the Mental Health Association of Frederick County. After about an hour on the phone with a Call Specialist who listened with a trained ear and spoke in a caring and comforting voice, her relief was visible. She was connected with a support group and resources that could help her cope with her grief and loss. She began to heal and had found the tools she needed to go on. I am happy to say that she is rediscovering love for her craft and is back on track to fulfill her dreams.
