# **Programs and Services**

#### PREPARING RESILIENT CHILDREN

Helping children learn mental and emotional resilience now will help them adapt to the situations and setbacks they'll face throughout life, and to become the strong, stable citizens our community needs. To prepare them for success and stability, we work in a few different ways:

- Providing guidance and information to first-time parents;
- Making sure every child has a developmentally appropriate learning environment; and
- · Working with parents and educators when children display behavioral issues.

These activities give children the emotional, social, and cognitive skills they'll carry throughout their lives into the classroom, the workplace, and the home.

#### SECURING VULNERABLE FAMILIES

Many family situations present pressing challenges that affect everyone in them. They not only disrupt entire families; they can leave children without a stable or permanent home and can increase a child's risk for struggles later in life like mental illness, unemployment, even prison.

So to help these children and families now, and in the future, MHA:

- Provides a safe location where parents and children can spend time together to renew or sustain supportive relationships;
- Makes sure children in difficult circumstances are able to get from one parent to the other safely; and
- Works to find the loving, permanent homes for children caught in an overburdened court system deserve.

## **Mental Health Professionals**

#### THE ROLE OF COUNSELING AND THE LICENSED SPECIALITIES

Professional counseling or therapy is a valuable part of growth and treatment for a variety of circumstances individuals face – from coping with everyday events to managing severe emotional problems. Each situation is unique and may be treated in a variety of manners. Therapy can improve quality of life and life choices; it can provide new alternatives for old behaviors; and it may identify more serious mental illnesses and offer specific treatments for emotional wellness and a quality life.

Common problems leading people to seek professional help are depression, anxiety, inability to concentrate, suicidal thoughts, changeable moods, problems with others, lack of self-confidence, family, and marital problems, and physical issues such as not sleeping, chronic tiredness, upset stomach, headaches and substance use or dependence.

All persons in counseling professions must be licensed in the state of Maryland and should have their credentials displayed. Professionally trained and licensed therapists will openly discuss their qualifications and specializations and provide you with their credentials if requested.

When choosing a therapist, it is important to know the training, educational background, experience, and treatment approach utilized by the therapist. Briefly listed below are the variety of mental health professionals who provide counseling and psychotherapy.

**Psychiatrist, M.D.:** Medical doctor with special training in psychiatry (study of the mind). Can prescribe medications. Must be a licensed physician in the state in which he/she practices, board eligible, or certified by the American Board of Psychiatry.

**Licensed Psychologist (Ph.D. or Psy.D.):** Holds a doctorate (Ph.D. or Psy.D.) in clinical psychology. The psychologists must be licensed by the Maryland Board of Psychologists in order to practice independently.

Licensed Clinical Social Worker (LBSW, LMSW, LCSW, LCSW-C): Holds a Master of Social Work (MSW) with specialization in clinical practice. A social worker must be licensed as a Licensed Certified Social Worker – Clinical by the Maryland Board of Social Work Examiners. Clinical social workers may hold additional licenses such as A.C.S.W. from the Academy of Certified Social Workers through the National Association of Social Workers. An LBSW or LMSW can provide therapy only under the supervision on an LCSW-C. **Board Certified Diplomat in Clinical Social Work (BCD):** Clinical social workers holding a Master Degree, more than five years of experience in mental health assessment, diagnosis, and treatment; they must pass an examination and meet other rigorous requirements for national certification by the American Board of Examiners in Social Work.

Licensed Clinical Professional Counselor (LCPC) / Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) / Licensed Graduate Professional Counselor (LGPC): Holds a Master Degree or doctorate in professional counseling, psychology, or rehabilitation counseling and must be licensed by the Maryland State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists. An LGPC practices under the license of an LCPC or LCSW-C.

Licensed Clinical Drug and Alcohol Counselor (LCADC): Holds a Master Degree in health and human services or counseling. He or she has completed two years of direct counseling experience under the supervision of a licensed mental health professional. They must pass the exam for master's addictions counselors of the National Board for Certified Counselors, and are licensed by the Maryland State Board of Professional Counselors and Therapists.

**Psychiatric and Mental Health Nurse Specialist (M.A., A.P.R.N.):** Holds a Master Degree in psychiatric nursing: certification requires two years of supervised clinical practice and licensed by the State of Maryland.

**Nationally Certified Counselor (N.C.C.):** Holds a Master Degree or doctorate in professional counseling, and are certified by the National Board for Certified Counselors.

**Certified Alcohol, Drug, and Chemical Dependency Counselor (CAC, CCDC, CDC):** Holds a Bachelor's Degree in counseling, social work, psychology, or applicable field of study. Certification by the Maryland Addictions Professional Certification Board requires a minimum of two years direct work experience with alcohol and/or drug clients.

**Pastoral Counselor:** Clinicians that offer faith-based therapy services to clients of all ages, across a diverse range of cultural and religious backgrounds and with a wide variety of therapeutic concerns. (based on client request)


**Art Therapist, Registered (A.T.R.):** The American Art Therapy Association, Inc. (AATA) defines entry level into the profession at the Master Degree level. The art therapists will have graduated from a minimum of a two-year master's program, or the equivalent, which will have included a minimum of 600 hours of supervised practicum experience. Those masters, institute, or clinical programs which are approved by AATA meet educational standards set forth by the association.



Patients receive individualized care through one-to-one interactions with mental health professionals, group therapies, psycho-education, family meetings, and concluding with customized, detailed, after-care plans. The FHH/ BHU provides a safe and healing environment close to home, which affords convenience for family visitation and coordination of care with local providers. We treat the full range of psychiatric illnesses and individuals with co-occurring disorders. All referrals are from the Emergency Department.

The treatment goal is stabilization and re-integration into the family, community, and career.

**HOW TO ACCESS PPHP:** Patients are admitted to PPHP from the FHH Emergency Crisis Management Services and the FHH Behavioral Health Unit. Staff coordinates directly with other hospital inpatient facilities and outpatient psychiatrists and therapists to assist patients who meet criteria for this level of care to access this service.
